“SHEFFEY”



“Sheffey” was filmed at a camp meeting and is based on the true story of Robert Sheffey, an American circuit-riding preacher of the early 1800s. An unusual servant of God, Sheffey was a rowdy young man who followed his friends to Camp Meeting, where he learned to seek first the kingdom. The film challenges assumptions while capturing the compassion of a man whose soul is on fire for the Lord.

Katherine Stenholm directed a crew of 76 and a cast of about 800, and the film includes a musical score by Dwight Gustafson. A large camp meeting scene was filmed at the nineteenth-century Epworth Camp Meeting in Greenwood, South Carolina, and other scenes were shot at Cades Cove and the Pioneer Farmstead in Great Smoky Mountains National Park, plus other nearby sites.
